This is an exciting opportunity to undertake doctoral study at the Institute for Transport Studies (ITS), one of the world's most esteemed centres for multi-disciplinary research. The successful applicant will join an internationally-leading team undertaking both pure and applied research that aims to develop a transport system for the future. Our aim is to develop people with enquiring minds to become instrumental in the future of transport.

## Eligibility

Applications are invited for the commencement of PhD study up to and including October 2017.

This scholarship is open to applicants who would be required to pay the International fee rate. The tuition fee for start dates up to August 2017 is £18,500 per year. The fee for start dates from September 2017 to August 2018 is £19,750 per year. This scholarship provides a contribution of £6,000 per year – applicants are expected to fund the remainder of the tuition fees from an alternative source, and will be asked to provide evidence of the additional funding. The scholarship does not include any contribution to living costs.
